Young Leaders Program

The **Young Leaders Program** consists of a customised suite of non-award academic focused short courses. It aims to help the next generation of international leaders achieve their potential. It is managed by the International Leaders Program team at the University's Office of Global Engagement.

The course

The Young Leaders Program: **Global Health** is a customised non-award multidisciplinary academic course. The course has a specific focus on developing students understanding of the latest developments, trends and innovations – as well as the challenges – in the worldwide healthcare sector.

It draws on the knowledge of experts from the University of Sydney and the health care sector to provide students with a wide ranging perspective. The academic component may be taught by academics and researchers from Arts and Social Sciences, Engineering and Information Technologies, Sciences, Health, Pharmacy and Medicine.

The course comprises of lectures, seminars, group work and educational field trips; balancing theory with clinical and professional knowledge. Classes are interactive and draw upon case studies and scenario based learning with an emphasis on real-world application. In addition, students will have an immersive experience of Australian culture and society through various social and cultural activities; providing a holistic opportunity to develop their intercultural awareness, communication and teamwork skills.

Program date

20 January to 2 February 2019

Participants

This program is specially curated for students of Shandong University, Cheloo College of Medicine. The multidisciplinary content is accessible and engaging for students of all specialisations from the College.

The course will be taught and assessed in English. Although we will not request evidence of a formal English language assessment, an adequate level of English language ability (IELTS 6.5, TOEFL IBT 79 or above) is recommended in order to achieve the best outcomes from the program.

Participants will have the opportunity to meet students from other leading universities with different academic backgrounds in joint lectures, and also meet local University of Sydney students.

Fee

The program fee of **AUD \$3950** per student covers:

- Welcome and Closing ceremony
- Tuition fee
- Field trips and admission
- Twin share accommodation in an apartment/hotel (room only, including wifi), from 20 January to 2 February 2019 (13 nights) within walking distance of the University
- Group airport pick-up on 20 January and transfer on 2 August 2019
